

Two local Scouts awarded Eagle rank

Joshua Lorenz Zock and Matthew Jonathan were awarded the rank of Eagle Scout at a Court of Honor ceremony on July 26 2014.

Joshua Lorenz Zock

Joshua has earned 36 merit badges and served the troop as Webmaster, Assistant Patrol Leader, then Patrol Leader and is now the Senior Patrol Leader.



He completed his major community service project with the help of the troop, friends, community organizations and businesses who volunteered a total of 327 man hours over 10 workdays. The project reconditioned the World War I Monument, installed pavers around the flagpole, and landscaped the front of the Montgomery Elementary School. This led to the rededication of the monument in a ceremony on Veterans Day. Joshua just finished ninth grade as an Honor Roll student and is a member of the National Junior Honor Society.

He has been on the Valley Central High School Varsity Swim Team for the past three years. Since he is only 15 years old he plans to continue his scouting experience and add to his two Eagle Palms.

After High School he plans to go to college and pursue his interest in Astro-Physics.

Matthew has earned 36 merit badges and served the troop in various leadership positions including Senior Patrol Leader and Junior Assistant Scoutmaster.

Hydrant Flushing

Hydrant flushing will be October 20th through the 24th. You may experience sporadic brown water. Let the faucet run with cold water for five minutes, and it should clear.

Leaf Pickup

The Village will be picking up leaves every Tuesday starting October 28 through November 25. Leaves must be bagged & placed curbside by 7:00 am. The compost site at DPW remains open. Residents should be aware-only leaves, grass clippings and small brush may be deposited at this site. No commercial compost allowed! Violators may be subject to a fine!
