Cartons
Orange juice, milk, broth, etc.

Metal cans & clean aluminum foil, pie plates & trays

#1, #2 and #4*, #5*, #7* plastic food & beverage containers (bottle & non-bottle packaging)

Phone books

Corrugated cardboard & paper bags (flattened)

Newspapers, brochures & inserts (no plastic bags, do not tie & bundle)

Paperboard boxes (cereal, pasta & tissue)

File folders & office paper

Cardboard beverage carriers

Junk mail, catalogs & magazines

Glass bottles & jars

Loose metal jar lids & steel bottle caps

Paper towel rolls

Paperback books

Not Acceptable

- No scrap metal
- No VHS/VCR tapes
- No plastic bags
- No needles or syringes
- No window panes, mirrors, ceramics & Pyrex® dishware
- No stickers or address label sheet waste
- No plastics other than those listed
- No electronic waste (batteries, cell phones, computers, etc.)
- No paint, pesticides, oil & cleansers
- No motor oil or antifreeze containers
- No organic material and food waste
- No waxed paper or waxed cardboard
- No Styrofoam™ or paper to-go containers
- No plastic caps
- No hard cover books

PLEASE NOTE:
—Village residents— are asked not to flush certain items down their drains (sinks, toilets, tubs etc.); paper towels, napkins, diapers, baby wipes, other wipes such as Clorox, Windex, etc., ladies' products, cloth or any similar-type materials.

These items are commonly found in the Village sewer system and can wreak havoc.

Many residents don't realize this, but such materials can cause blockages in the system, which can result in sewer backups in homes, businesses and other facilities.

Please try to be considerate and dispose of such materials properly. It will save money and prevent problems in the long run.

It is with deep regret that I report the recent passing of two longtime friends of the Village of Montgomery. Ann Galletly Rosenbloom passed away on September 14th, and Larry Shafer passed on September 11th. Ann was 96, and Larry was 100 and both added so much to the fabric of our historic and storied Village.

Ann was a longstanding employee of Brescia Lumber having worked for my great-grandfather, grandfather and father. She was like an aunt to me and taught me many lessons growing up. Ann was extremely active, even in her golden years. Being an integral part of the New Horizons Senior Club and the Silverados Step Dancers, Ann never let the grass grow around her. In recent years she received an honor from Orange County for outstanding contribution by a Senior. Volunteering at Castle Point and the American Legion Post 531 were also part of her resume' as well as being a longtime member of the First Presbyterian Church and the Woman's Guild. Ann was the widow of longtime Village Mayor, Lester Rosenbloom. Her many contributions and memories will live on.

Larry grew up in the Village 100 years ago before, he moved to the Walden area. He was a former Grand

Marshal of General Montgomery Day and is fondly remembered for his kind nature and cordial way. He was old Montgomery through and through, and he loved to tell memorable stories about growing up in our historic village.

He was a lifetime member of Walden Fire Dept. and was honored many times for his firematic accomplishments and his selfless contributions to his community. He was a fixture riding in the General Montgomery Day parade with horse drawn carriage or pulling the old Enterprise Steamer by horse. Larry was predeceased by his sister, Dorothy Rudolph, longtime Village of Montgomery Clerk. Thanks
