- Cartons
- Metal cans & clean aluminum foil, pie plates & trays
- #1, #2 and #4*, #5*, #7* plastic food & beverage containers (bottle & non-bottle packaging)
- Phone books
- Corrugated cardboard & paper bags (flattened)
- Newspapers, brochures & inserts (no plastic bags, do not tie & bundle)
- Paperboard boxes (cereal, pasta & tissue)
- Cardboard beverage carriers
- File folders & office paper
- Glass bottles & jars
- Junk mail, catalogs & magazines
- Loose metal jar lids & steel bottle caps
- Paper towel rolls
- Paperback books

Not Acceptable

- No scrap metal
- No VHS/VCR tapes
- No plastic bags
- No needles or syringes
- No window panes, mirrors, ceramics & Pyrex® dishware
- No stickers or address label sheet waste
- No plastics other than those listed
- No electronic waste (batteries, cell phones, computers, etc.)
- No paint, pesticides, oil & cleansers
- No motor oil or antifreeze containers
- No organic material and food waste
- No waxed paper or waxed cardboard
- No Styrofoam™ or paper to-go containers
- No plastic caps
- No hard cover books

PLEASE NOTE:

Village residents are asked not to flush certain items down their drains (sinks, toilets, tubs etc.), paper towels, napkins, diapers, baby wipes, other wipes such as Clorox, Windex, etc., ladies' products, cloth or any similar-type materials.

These items are commonly found in the Village sewer system and cause blockages in the system, which can result in sewer backups in homes, businesses and other facilities.

Village Compost Site

The hours of operation are 7 a.m. until 3 p.m. Monday through Friday and Saturdays 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. This is for Village residents only and not commercial dumping. The Village will pickup curbside for a nominal fee. Please make arrangement with the D.P.W. at 457-5321. This applies for bulk pickup as well, which can be picked up curbside for a fee.

Village of Montgomery News

The new Redi-Rock Wall abutting the parking lot behind the Village Hall is nearly complete.

The Municipal Parking Lot and the parking area behind the Village will be repaved sometime in September.

New granite curbing will also be installed in the Municipal Parking Lot, and the area will be expanded three feet in an easterly direction (toward the Village Hall). The granite curbing behind the Village Hall has already been installed.

The four remaining Jeldwen Windows will be installed in the front of the Village Hall hopefully by year's end. These are the arch-top windows with many divided lites.

Another project that should be completed by the end of the year is replacement of the standing seam roof, in kind, on the Village Museum. The roof will also receive plywood

sheathing. This renovation will enhance the beauty of the building, not to mention prevent leaks, which have been prevalent of late.

The concrete slab in front of the Village Bandstand will also receive new blue stone pavers in the near future. They will be resistant to salt as well.

The Village of Montgomery flushes the Hydrants two times per year. This is usually done in the Spring and the Fall. This procedure is done to flush out any sediment or substance in the water lines. This keeps the water clean and clear for consumption and use.
